We are pleased to have heard back from many of the new families who will be joining our school community in September. We do still have places available in our Reception cohort for September.

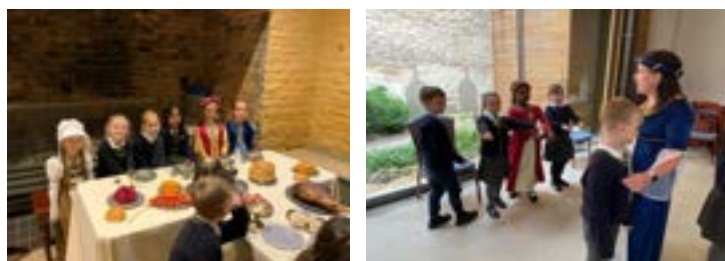
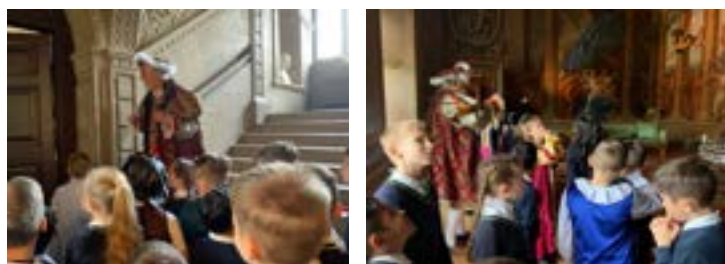


Are you a parent of a child born between September 1, 2018 and August 31, 2019? It's time to start planning for them to start school in September 2023.

Year 3 visit to Burghley House

During our school trip to Burghley House, we got to meet King Henry VIII! The children got to listen to his ideas and decisions about his role as Monarch and his justifications regarding his treatment of his wives. The children got to ask King Henry VIII questions and they really enjoyed talking to him. The children got to explore the house, looking into the rooms preserved as they once were. They got to learn about how the Tudors lived and how life was very different between the rich/royalty and the poor servants. They were even tasked with counting how many secret doors they could find throughout the tour. In the afternoon the children were able to explore the Tudor kitchen and what food they would have been served, from the Monarch at the head of the table and an everyday citizen at the other end. They also got to enjoy learning about different Tudor games, as this was the only form of entertainment for children during this time. To end their day, the children were taught a Tudor Pavane dance, learning a series of simple steps and learning how to bow and curtsy when greeting someone, especially those of high rank. It was an incredible day and we all had such a wonderful time learning about the Tudors at Burghley House.



Year 1 visit to Hunstanton
