The information from this survey will be used to understand our current strengths and potential areas of improvements.

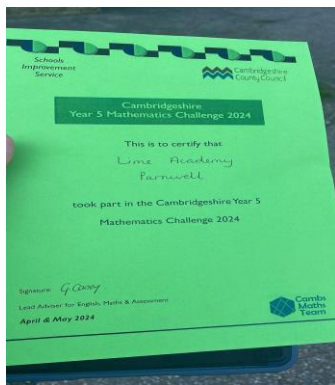
