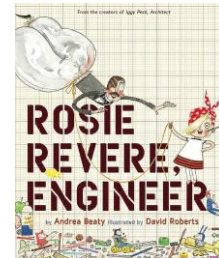

Please note if you want your child to have a school dinner and you are required to pay for this please ensure you regularly top up their Arbor account, please see the office if you have any issues with this.

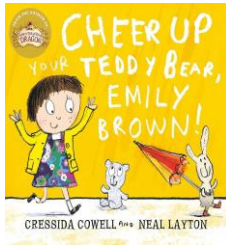
Book Recommendations.

OPAL

As part of our OPAL (Outdoor Play and Learn) project for breaktimes and lunchtimes, we will be launching a new play policy.

Today, we launched the children's version, developed in collaboration with the School Council. Each part is split into what our pupils have the right to and therefore what their responsibilities must be to maintain their right



Children's Play Policy

We have the right to have fun at playtimes.
We have the responsibility to make sure that everyone has fun and our play does not stop this.
We have the right to make our own decisions about our play and choose what we do.

We have the responsibility to make sure our decisions don't affect others in a negative way.
We have the right to choose who we play with.
We have the responsibility that no one is left out of play or forced to do something they don't want to.
We have the right to play with lots of different toys and have a well looked-after environment.
We have the responsibility to take pride in, respect and look after our environment and toys.
We have the right to explore, be creative and take thoughtful risks.
We have the responsibility to think about what we are doing and talk to a Play Leader about the risks we are taking if they ask us to.

Reminders:

Reminder to all parents that children should only be bringing in bottles of water and not squash or juice. Also their snacks should be healthy options and not bags of crisps, sweets or chocolate.

Nuts

Please can we remind parents not to send their child in with food which contains nuts due to other learners having severe allergies to nuts.

Attendance

Just a reminder that if your child is absent you are required to call the office to report them absent with your child's name, class and details of the absence each day of absence.

Please can I also remind you that any appointments are to be made outside of school times where possible.

If you wish to take your child out of school, you are required to complete a leave of absence form to be submitted to the school office to be given to the Head Teacher for approval prior to absence and evidence to be provided, this will be either authorised or unauthorised.

Breakfast club and afterschool club


On 26th February we changed to a pre-booking service for breakfast club and afterschool club. This is a gentle reminder that you need to book your child on Arbor onto the clubs 24 hours prior to the date required and this must be paid for at time of booking. If your child is not booked in, in enough time, then they will not be able to attend.
